

AN OVERVIEW OF THE ANCIENT PRAYER PRACTICES PART TWO

Prayer of Confession

◆ Prayer of confession is a very ancient form of prayer. We find Moses telling the Hebrew people, "When you realize your guilt in any of these, you shall confess the sin that you have committed" (Leviticus 4:5). The call to confession is a constant theme throughout the Bible. For example, 1 John 1:9 tell us, "If we

confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

- In general, prayers of confession are a way for us to show humility before God.
- Prayers of confession can be individual where a person confesses to God a specific sin or shortcoming. They can also be done in a group setting such as worship. You may have noticed that I include a prayer of confession on the Sundays when we have Holy Communion. These corporate prayers are usually broad in scope.
- Here is a simple Prayer of Confession that is corporate in nature but could be made personal simply by changing the plural pronouns like "we" and "us" to "I" and "me."
 - God of truth, you have spoken your Word to us and in us but we have not listened to you. We have not been mindful of your presence, or attentive to your voice. * Have mercy on us, forgive us, and heal us. Speak your Word in us now, and create us anew. We open ourselves to your presence. Amen.

At the asterisk (*), more specific shortcomings can be added, if desired.

The Labyrinth

 Labyrinths can be traced back 3,500 years and are used by many cultures and faith traditions. The labyrinth became important to Christendom during the crusades and the Black Death when pilgrimage to the Holy Land was dangerous. Labyrinths were used as a pilgrimage-in place. Pilgrims could engage in the same kind of prayer journey without leaving home



- One can physically walk through the labyrinth, or simply traverse one's finger along the winding paths of a depiction of a labyrinth while focusing mind and spirit on the journey.
- The journey of the Labyrinth is simple. The path to the center and the path out are one and the same. The Labyrinth is not a maze or a puzzle. It is simply a path.
- There are three stages of the Labyrinth:
 - 1. **Purgation**. This refers to the journey into the center of the labyrinth. It is a time for releasing, letting go of the details of your life, the cares and concerns that keep you distracted and stressed.
 - 2. **Illumination.** The center is a place for clarity and insight. Stay in here as long as you like. Receive what is there for you. Before you leave, give thanks to God for the time together and for any insights you have received or unburdening you have felt.
 - 3. **Union.** The path out of the labyrinth is symbolic of the alignment, or union, of your will with God's will. This union will bring you back into the world with a renewed vision or a refreshed spirit.





Song as Prayer

- Some people connect to God through song. For me, singing my prayers keeps my mind focused on the task at hand, which means my mind does not wonder while I am praying.
- This prayer practice is simply. Find a song that can serve as a prayer with words easy to remember and a tune that resonates with your soul and sing it. Our United Methodist songbooks contain many songs of prayer.
 - * For, example, the hymn, "Spirit of the Living God" (*The United Methodist Hymnal*, #393), prays "Spirit of the living God, fall afresh on me. Spirit of the living God, fall afresh on me. Melt me, mold me, fill me, use me. Spirit of the living God, fall afresh on me."
 - * For people familiar with the country gospel song, "Just a Closer Walk with Thee," I recommend its refrain: "Just a closer walk with thee, grant it, Jesus, is my plea, daily walking close to thee: Let it be, dear Lord, let it be." This hymn is #2158 in *The Faith We Sing*.
- Change the words if you like to more accurately express the concerns of your hearts.

Praying in Nature

- Praying in General with Nature
 - * Be intentional about encountering God when you are in a natural setting.
 - * As you notice God's creation in general or a part of it in particular, what thoughts or feelings are stirred within you?
 - * Consider how creation reflects God's wisdom, power, and love.
 - * Reflect on your relationship with nature. What responsibilities does humankind have toward it given that God has made all things and called them good?
 - * Give thanks to God for the gift of the natural world.
- Deep Examination of an Item from Nature
 - Select an item from nature to be examined. This could be an animal, a flower, a star, water, or whatever catches your attention.
 - Spend a few minutes examining the item you chose. Think about the unique characteristics of the item. How it was formed and what is its function in nature?
 - Considering Romans 1:20, "Ever since the creation of the world his eternal power and divine nature, invisible though they are, have been understood and seen through the things he has made," how does this item reflect God's eternal power and divine nature.
 - Take some time to appreciate the items place in God's creation.
 - Close your prayer time by giving thanks to God for this item and for all of creation.

Why are there different colored altar cloths?

The Christian year has two cycles: the Christmas Cycle (Advent-Christmas-Epiphany) and the Easter Cycle (Lent-Easter-Pentecost). Within each cycle are a preparatory season symbolized by the color purple and a festival season symbolized by the color white. After each



cycle there is an ordinary time of growth symbolized the color green. Thus there is a sequence of seasons using purple, white, and green in that order twice each year. (*The United Methodist Book of Worship*, Copyright © 1992 The United Methodist Publishing House

- Purple, representing both royalty and penitence, is traditionally used during Advent and Lent.
- Blue symbolizes hope and may also be used during Advent.
- White and gold are used at Christmas and Easter to symbolize joy and festivities.
- **Red** symbolizes the color of fire to represent the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost and times when the work of the Holy Spirit is emphasized. During Holy Week it represents the blood of Christ. Red is also used for ordinations, church anniversaries and civil observances such as Memorial Day and Thanksgiving.
- Green represents growth and is used during Ordinary Time (the season after Epiphany and the season after Pentecost.
